

## Curfew in Kaduna as fresh violence erupts

TENSION gripped Kaduna metropolis on Wednesday as fresh round of violence

erupted in Kafanchan in the southern part of the state. This was said to have followed the discovery of a corpse at Ungwan Katsit near the palace of the Emir of Jema'a, Alhaji Muhammadu

Isa Muhammadu. Our correspondent gathered that the violence broke out on Wednesday morning as rampaging youths in Katsit allegedly identified the corpse as that of an Hausa Muslim.
