
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Police kill six armed robbers in Rivers

Police on Monday killed six members of an armed robbery gang in Port Harcourt, Rivers State.

The hoodlums were said to have snatched N2.1m from a businessman who had gone to one of the new generation banks on Olu Obasanjo Avenue to withdraw the money.

An eyewitness said the armed robbers, who trailed the victim from the bank in a white Toyota Hilux vehicle, overtook him before taking the money from him at gunpoint.

On getting wind of the robbery, a police patrol team reportedly moved to the spot to confront the robbers.

The eyewitness said the suspects opened fire on the police, leading to an exchange of gunfire, creating commotion on Olu Obasanjo Avenue and Orugbum Crescent, New Port

Harcourt GRA.

The state Deputy Commissioner of Police, Administration, Mrs. Diseye Nsirim, said a Kia Cerato car snatched by the robbers was used by the hoodlums in the operation.

She said, "At about 12.25pm, a man in a black Ford Ranger jeep went to Access Bank, Olu Obasanjo Way and withdrew the sum of N2.1m. On his way back to his office, along Orogbum Crescent, he was overtaken by the armed robbers driving in a white Hilux car.

"They robbed him of the whole money and there was a distress call to the Rivers State Police Command as the robbers were running away.

"As the robbers were escaping with their loot, they engaged the police in a fierce gun battle and at the end six of them were fatally wounded."

Nsirim also said two of the vehicles – a white Toyota Hilux van and a Kia Cerato, two AK-47 riffles with three magazines, 10 rounds of 3.8 special ammunition, two number plates and N500,000 were recovered from the suspects.

She described the suspects, whose remains were displayed at the State Police Command, as having terrorised the state in recent times. Nsirim said no policeman lost his life during the gun duel adding that the swift response from the police command was planned and well-executed.

Meanwhile, the peace of Onitsha, the commercial hub of Anambra State was shattered on Monday when a gang of armed robbers killed two people, wounding two policemen in front of a bank along the New Market Road

The deceased were a young woman, said to be taking a huge sum of money to the bank, and the commercial motorcycle rider, who was taking her to the bank.

The policemen were guarding the bank at the time of the attack. The incident sent people around the area scampering to safety.

A witness said the five-man gang, who operated on motorcycles, had apparently trailed the women on her way to the bank.

THE PUNCH learnt that while she was alighting from the

motorcycle, the robbers struck. They fatally shot the young lady and the motorcyclist. They also shot at the two policemen that were attached to the bank.



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
