gave his name as Lateef Adegbola, said, "The event occurred while the worshippers were singing and dancing, suddenly, a big bang was heard. A part of the building collapsed on the worshippers.

Adegbola, who said some people in the area raced to the scene to rescue the worshippers before the firefighters came.

Four lifeless bodies and

Four lifeless bodies and 15 wounded members of the church, trapped in the collapsed building, were said to have been removed. When visited, men of the Oyo State Fire Service and sympathisers were still on rescue operation.

Governor Abiola Ajimobi, who visited the scene, assured the people that his administration would assist the victims of the wreckage.

He, however, advised those living along the water courses in the state to desist from indiscriminate dumping of refuse on the water ways to avert a reoccurrence of flood disaster in the state.

He blamed the incident on the failure of the contractor handling the church building to use quality materials in a bid to cut cost.

He said. "If the contractor had not compromised quality, this incident would not have happened." The governor ordered that thorough investigation be carried out on the circumstances surrounding the collapse of the building."
