Police arrest husband for wife's death

THE death of a 30-year-old housewife, Toyin Adeboye, in Abeokuta, Ogun State has landed her husband, Dare, in police net.

The husband of the deceased was arrested because Toyin's family members alleged that they suspected a foul play in her death.

They insisted that the husband was a prime suspect in the death of the mother of two.

The family members subsequently invited the police at the Ibara Division, which arrested and detained Dare on Monday.

Our correspondent learnt that the death of the housewife occurred at the couple's house in the Imo area of the state.

Her remains were allegedly still being kept in the house.

A member of the family, who pleaded anonymity, told PUNCH Metro that the family became

serious problem with her husband.

"Although we don't know the nature of the family's problem, the next thing we heard was that she was dead. I learnt that it was Dare that called to tell the family about the new development.

"She was not sick, so we need some serious explanation before we can bury her."

It was gathered that the family members were demanding autopsy to know the cause of her death, as well as a thorough police investigation.

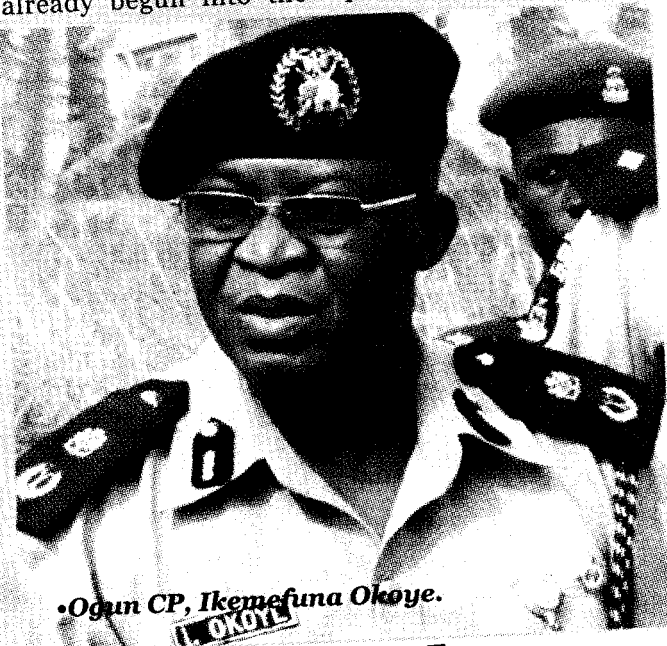
The state Police Public Relations Officer, Muiyiwa Adejobi,
