Another victim of Nyanya bomb blast dies

About two weeks after the bomb blast in a motor park at Nyanya area of the Federal Capital Territory, Abuja, another victim of the explosion simply identified as Olalekan from Kwara State has been confirmed dead.

The deceased was said to have died on Thursday morning in the Intensive Care Unit of the National Hospital, Abuja, where he was receiving treatment.

The spokesperson for the hospital, Dr. Tayo Haastrup, disclosed this in an interview with *Saturday PUNCH* in Abuja.

"We lost one of them yesterday (Thursday) morning; he is a young Yoruba man with three young children and a wife. They are in the process of taking his corpse now to his home town in Kwara State for burial", he stated.

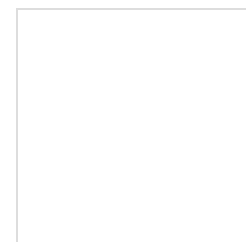
