CJ to reassign BGL's suit to new judge

THE Chief Judge of the Federal High Court, Justice Ibrahim Auta, has recalled the case file of BGL Group from Justice Mohammed Yunusa, to whom it was assigned as a vacation judge.

The development prevented Justice Yunusa from delivering

However, Justice Yunusa, who heard the case as a vacation judge, last week Thursday vacated Justice Saidu's restraining order preventing BGL's expulsion.

Yunusa, in his ruling, had said he was convinced that BGL obtained the order from Justice Saidu by concealing material facts.
