A 38-year-old suspected member of the Eye Confraternity, Ibrahim Ogundiyele, has been remanded in prison by an Ebute Meta Magistrates' court for the alleged murder of two siblings in the Surulere area of Lagos State.

The Magistrate, A.O. Ajibade, ordered his remand in prison pending

the release of legal advice from the Directorate of Public Prosecutions.

Ogundiyele was arraigned before the court on four counts of murder and belonging to an unlawful society.

He was said to have conspired with

other members of his gang, to kill the victims – Muftau Akewusola (27) and Malik Akewushola (22) – at Akerele Extension, Surulere.

Detectives from the State Department of Criminal Investigation, Yaba, said the defendant confessed to the crime and

was arrested with exhibits.

The charges read in part, "That you, Ibrahim Ogundiyele, and others now at large, on May 2, 2015 at about 8.15pm at Akerele Extension, Surulere, Lagos, in the Lagos Magisterial District, did conspire amongst yourselves to commit

felony to wit: murder and thereby committed an offence."

The police prosecutor, Sergeant Daniel Ighodalo, who applied for the remand of the defendant in prison, said the offences were punishable under sections 231, 221, 42, and 41 of the Criminal Law of Lagos State, Nigeria, 2011.
