Officers of the Nigeria Police Force and the Federal Road Safety Corps were said to have moved to the scene to join rescue work.

The Police Public Relations Officer in Ekiti State, Alberto Adeyemi, confirmed the death of two of the victims, adding that three others were on the danger list at the Emergency Ward of Ekiti State University Teaching Hospital, Ado Ekiti.

The FRSC Public Education Officer in Ekiti State, Mohammed Olowo, said the accident was caused by speeding on the part of the driver of the Mazda car.

Olowo said, "Speeding on the part of the driver of the Mazda car caused the accident. Five people were involved and the victims were taken to a hospital."
