Widow accuses police of indifference kill 20-year-old

WHEN Emmanuel Omuta had his mother's funeral while leaving for a vigil last Friday, little did they know they were exchanging their last plenarian.

The 20-year-old was reportedly killed by suspected robbers, who made away with his laptop in the Aghado Crossing area of Ogun State while he was returning from

Generator fumes kill three family members in Osogbo

THREE members of a family residing at the Olorisanwo Compound, Osogbo, Osun State were found dead in their home in the early hours of Thursday.

Although their death was blamed on many factors, including the last meal ate by the late police Sergeant Mary Samuel and her family, but security sources said the victims might have been killed by generators.

A security source, who pleaded anonymity, told our correspondent that the late Samuel had a torch in her hand when security men gained access into her apartment, adding that she must have stumbled while heading towards the direction of the kitchen, where a generator was kept.

Others found dead in the apartment located on the ground floor of a storey building behind the Osogbo Central Mosque apart from Samuel, were her daughter, Abigail, and

Samuel, said to be an indigene of Ekiti State, was married to another policeman from Kogi State and served at the Works Department of the Osun State Police Command until her death.

The remains of the deceased were deposited in the morgue of LAUTECH, Osogbo.

The Police Public Relations Officer for the Osun State Command, Folasade Odum, said carbon monoxide emission from a generator was reasonably suspected to have been the cause of the death.

"The only person not affected by the fumes was a four-month-old granddaughter of the deceased. She was taken away by neighbours as the curses of the others were being evacuated."

Samuel, said to be an indigene of Ekiti State, was married to another policeman from Kogi State and served at the Works Department of the Osun State Police Command until her death.

In the morning, when his brother was going out, he saw his brother's corpse beside the road. He immediately ran home to inform me. By the time I got there, I realised that he was the one.

"The puzzling part of the whole story is that a police

station is just three minutes' walk to the place where he was attacked by the criminals and despite the fact that the incident has been reported, the police have neither made any arrest nor done anything about it."

The widowed mother said she had yet to recover from the grief of losing her husband, adding that the deceased had a promising future.

"He (Emmanuel) was my third child but he was very close to my heart. As speak to you, my spirit is still with him. If not because of the support of the church, probably would have died too because I have yet to receive from the death of their father I can only be at peace when

Some people in the area told us that the criminals already marked their own territory, which the police could not infiltrate. Some said the criminals are popularly called 'Omo Federal' in that Agbado Station area."

When the Ogun State Police Public Relations Officer, Abimbola Oyeyemi, was contacted, he said the allegation was baseless, adding that investigation must be made before any arrest could be effected.

The family friend stated, "When the incident happened, I was called upon by the family, because the deceased was very close to me and he was an obedient boy. The duty of the police is to protect lives and properties, but they failed a 20-year-old boy, who just gained admission to a higher institution and had a promising future."

"I went to the Ayala Police Station with my friends to ask them how possible it was for someone to be attacked very close to the station and they couldn't hear any noise. Besides the fact that there is a police station that is a short distance away, there is also a police post closer to where the incident happened."

"During our interaction with the police, we found out that the police officers heard the cry of the boy for help but they refused to help him. One of the policemen had the
