Adamawa flooding kills five, sacks hundreds from homes

Flooding which took
over many parts of
Adamawa State on
Tuesday killed five
persons in the Yola North
Local Government Area of
the state. Three were from
Yola North and two from
Lamurde and Song council
areas in the state.

The flooding caused by
downpour recorded across
the state according to
reports also wreaked havoc
in several other council
areas and sacked many
from their homes.

Several households in
Lamurde, Yola North, Yola
South, Numan, Demsa and
Song were submerged by
in the downpour which
began around 3pm on

Thursday and continued
into the evening.

According to the
transitional chairman, Yola
North Local Government
Council, Adamu Ibrahim,
who spoke with journalist
after assessing the damage
caused by the flood said
three children, in Yola North,
died from the floods which
submerged over 20,000
houses.

The deaths recorded in
Yola North council area
occurred in three different
locations, namely Kasuwa
Buwu, Kofare and Bachure,
which were the areas worst
hit by the incident.

The state governor,
Ahmadu Fintiri, visited
Bachure and Jambutu
which were among areas
affected by the flooding.
