## Three killed in Taraba, say police

**T**HE Taraba State Police Command on Wednesday confirmed that at least three people were killed in the Wukari Local Government Area of the state.

The Police Public Relations Officer in the state, ASP David Misal, who confirmed the killings in a telephone interview with our correspondent in Jalingo, said one person was killed in an ambush along the Taraba section of the Wukari-

Katsina-Ala Road while two were killed on their farm along the Wukari-Ibi Road in the Wukari LGA.

"A passenger vehicle travelling from the East to Mubi in Adamawa State was shot at by suspected militia at a village near Wukari in Taraba State and a passenger was killed in the attack.

"We also got information that two persons were killed on their farm along the Wukari-Ibi LGA," the PPRO said.

The Taraba State Government had on Saturday, after a security meeting, agreed to set up a 30-man committee to address insecurity.

When contacted on Wednesday, the Senior Special Assistant to Governor Darius Ishaku on Media and Publicity, Mr Bala Dan-Abu, said members of the committee had yet to be named.

On the joint security task force team proposed by the government during the security meeting, Dan-Abu said the task force team was to be constituted by the Federal Government, adding that the state government was ready to support any initiative for the attainment of peace.
