Ogun condemns students killing by customs

The Governor of Ogun State, Dapo Abiodun, says he is shocked by the killing of three secondary students in the state by officials of the Nigeria Customs Service.

The three students of Ojumo Community High School Ogun State were reportedly crushed to death on Monday at Ihunbo, in the Ipokia Local Government Area by customs officials driving a confiscated vehicle.

The governor in a statement on Tuesday by his media aide, Kunle Somorin, said it was reprehensible that "young students with promising future lost their lives in such a manner."

Abiodun vowed to investigate the killing of the students.

Meanwhile, the students killing was also condemned by the Yoruba Youth Socio-cultural Association Worldwide, Ogun State chapter.

In a statement on Tuesday by its Ogun State coordinator, Farouk Shitta, YYSA blamed the death of the three students on reckless driving, which it said was common among customs officials.
