Rivers slain deliveryman's widow begs for help over notice to quit

The widow of an online store delivery man murdered and dumped in a septic tank along Ada George Road in Port Harcourt, Rivers State, has cried out for help over a notice to quit by her landlord.

The deceased, Chukwuma Eleje, was said to be delivering two iPhones to some customers who ordered them through the online store when he was attacked and killed on March 27, 2017.

Speaking to our correspondent in Port Harcourt on Thursday, the widow identified only

as Blessing who is a mother of three said fending for herself and her children had

become difficult since her husband's death.

While soliciting the assistance of the public, she said her late husband had yet to be

buried and that the case was still in court.

She said, "My appeal to the public is to help me to have roof over my head. Then I

want to start a small business to cater to my children. Life has not been easy. My

landlord has given me a date to leave his house if I can't pay rent. He said we should

pack and go to the village. If I'm in the village, I can't attend to my husband's case in

court. I need help."
