

Motorist killed in Lagos crash

A yet-to-identified driver has lost his life in an auto crash at the Alasia bus stop on the Lekki-Epe Expressway in Lagos State.

It was gathered that the crash, which occurred around 8.30am, involved a Toyota Camry car with number plate KSF 920 FF and a tipper lorry with number plate ENU 576 ZZ.

PUNCH Metro learnt that the driver of the truck, which was laden with granite, lost control and rammed into the car.

Our correspondent learnt that the car driver died on the spot, while an unidentified male was also injured.

The Lagos State Emergency Management Agency's Public Relations Officer, Nosa Okubor, who confirmed the accident said, "On getting to the scene, a Toyota Camry saloon car with number plate KSF 920 FF was found. Further investigations revealed that the car was run into by a granite-laden tipper lorry with number plate ENU 576 ZZ as a result of brake failure.

"The driver of the car was severely crushed by the impact of the collision and died instantly. He was extricated from the vehicle by an expert team of the LASEMA Response Squad and another victim, who suffered leg injuries, was rescued and administered first aid by the LASEMA paramedic team."
