Police kill two robbers, recover laptop, TV in Niger

HE Niger State Police Command said it had killed two suspected members of a notorious armed robbery gang that attempted to operate at New Gwarinpa, Madalla in the Suleia Local Government Area of the state.

The Police Public Relations Officer, Wasiu Abiodun, in a statement on Sunday, said this followed an exchange of gunfire between the police and members of the gang on September 17, 2020.

Abiodun said in the process, two of the suspected robbers sustained gunshot injuries and one of them died on the spot, while the other died at the Lucas. Clinic, Madalla, where he was taken to for treatment.

He added that a member of the gang, Haruna Mohammed of Gauraka, was apprehended at Zuba with gunshots wounds. was taken for treatment and confessed to being a member of the syndicate that had been making life unbearable for residents of Gwarinpa in Madalla.

Abiodun said items recovered from the robbers included two laptop computers and two plasma televisions.

The spokesman said the items were recovered from the suspects by police personnel attached to the 'C' Division, Madalla, who responded to a distress call.

Abiodun, who said command had declared war against criminality in the state. added, "We are going to make
