Osun shot hunter dies, Chinese miners' abductors demand N10m

State Police HE Osun Command, on Wednesday, confirmed the death of a hunter shot by gunmen, who invaded a mining site in Itikan village near Ifewara.

A member of the state chapter of the Hunters Group of Nigeria, who preferred anonymity, confirmed the incident to our correspondent, but further information about the deceased could not obtained as the

source declined further comments.

Meanwhile, the gunmen have demanded N10m as ransom for the victims.

Opalola disclosed this while featuring on a road programme monitored Osogbo in Wednesday.

She said the combined team of police and other security agencies had launched a manhunt for the kidnappers.

She stated, "The kidnappers are demanding ransom and we are still working on ways to rescue the Chinese.

"The kidnappers are demanding N10m before they will release the expatriates.

"We plead with the general public to help the police with information that will help our men to be more efficient in securing lives and property in the state."
