Nine die in Benue, Delta herders' attack, market levy tussle

Benue and Delta states to suspecte herders attack and tussle over mark levy.

In the Benue incident, abo five persons were reportedly killed by suspects herdsmen who stormed some villages in Gwer We Local Government area of Benue State in the ear

hours of Friday.

However, some of the armed herdsmen were sa to have escaped with gunshot wounds after troops Operation Whirl Stroke trailed them to the Bent Wasarawa border and engaged them in a gun duel.

According to locals, the armed herdsmen fir invaded Ahume Village along Makurdi/Naka Roz and dislodged by the troops who stationed at the village to ward off possible attack by the invaders.

One of the locals who identified himself. Aver said while the troops were patrolling Ahun community, the herdsmen invaded Tse-Nyar village and started shooting indiscriminately, killir five people and injuring others including a pregnation woman.

It was learned that the five dead bodies we recovered by security agencies, while three othe including a pregnant woman were rescued alive wi severe gunshot injuries even as many were said still be missing.

The local added that the dead bodies had been evacuated and the injured taken to hospital for treatment.

Aver said, "Last night there was a distress call th herdsmen attacked Ahume village along Makurc Naka road. As troops stationed in Kula village we alerted, the bandits ran to another village Tse Nyar where they killed three people.

"Many others were injured. The soldiers follow and met the bandits at the river bank on the bord between Benue and Nasarawa states where the exchanged fire with them. They however crossed the river and escaped into Nasarawa State."

On Tuesday, suspected herdsmen invaded the Abagana IDP camp on the outskirts of Makur killing seven people and injuring nine others.

When contacted, the Police Public Relation Officer, DSP Catherine Anene, said she had yet reserve the report.

Also, in Delta State, four persons died durit an illeged lingering market tussle between twhrel and Ekiugbo communities in the Ughelli North loc government area of Delta State.

City Round gathered that the victims were the male and a female whose identity could not l immediately ascertained as at press time.

It was also gathered that two of the deceased we shot and their corpses dumped at the entrance to or of the communities, the female victim was shot at tl front of her store and later died at the hospital, whi the last victim was killed on Thursday midnight,

A source in one of the communities said there was an issue between both communities concerning legislection from traders and they agreed that nobos should collect levy from any trader until the issu were addressed.

The state acting police spokesperson, DSP Brig Edafe, had yet to pick calls made to his mobile as of the time of filing this report. But the Executive Chairma of Ughelli North Local Government Area, Mr Godw Adode, on Friday ordered the total closure of the Ughelli main market until further notice.
