Youths barricade highway as three killed in Akwa Ibom

HREE women lost their lives while a male was injured in an auto crash near Akon community on the Calabar-Itu Road in the Itu Local Government Area of Akwa Ibom State.

PUNCH Metro gathered that the accident occurred on-Saturday around 7.45pm when a tricycle rider ran into a Mack truck.

All three female occupants aboard the tricycle died on the spot.

Our correspondent learnt that vouths in the area, who were irked by frequent accidents on the road, barricaded the Calabar-Itu highway for several hours, causing gridlock that stretched

neighbouring to Odiok, a community.

Thousands of passengers

were said to have been stranded as a result of the barricade.

PUNCH Metro was told that the group sang solidarity songs and welded machetes and sticks, scaring away officers of the Federal Road Safety Corps who came for a rescue operation.

Corps The Deputy Commander in charge of David Operations, FRSC, Ironuje, described the accident as unfortunate.

He said the command had been preaching to road users to always take necessary precautions while driving on highways to minimise road crashes in the state.
