Seven travellers killed as bus from Zamfara crashes in Osun, catches fire

CEVEN passengers in a commercial bus said to be travelling from Zamfara State in the early hours of Tuesday, died in a road accident that occurred along Ilesa/Osu Expressway.

The Osun Field Commander of Amotekun Corps, Amitolu Shittu, in an interview with our correspondent, said his men were the first responders at the scene of the accident.

Shittu said the driver of the bus travelling to Osun from Zamfara State, lost control, hit a billboard and went up in flames.

According to him, the men of Federal Fire Service and the Federal Road Safety Corps later joined his men that were on patrol on the road and rescued some of the travellers.

He said, "The passenger bus was travelling from Zamfara State and it got burnt in the early hours of Tuesday in Ilesha. We were on patrol in Llesha around 3.45 am when the incident occurred.

"The vehicle was on top speed when the driver lost control and it veered off the road and hit a billboard. It is an 18-passenger bus. Some of the occupants were burnt beyond recognition."

Giving further insight into the accident, the Osun FRSC Sector Commander, Paul Okpe, said seven persons lost their lives, adding that four of the deceased were burnt beyond recognition.

Okpe lamented high rate of disregard for traffic rules along Gbongan/Owena corridor in the state where the accident occurred.

He said, "A Toyota Hiace

18-passenger bus was involved in the accident and seven people died. Four of them burnt beyond recognition. There is more road violation along that road.

"That is our major challenge in Osun, between Gbongan and Owena. Also, everybody has the right to travel in the night, but we are just advising against it, because night comes with a lot of challenges."

We won't recruit repentant B'Haram fighters, says CDS

THE Chief of Defence Staff. ■ General Lucky Irabor, has said no ex-Boko Haram fighter has been recruited into the Nigerian military.

He also disclosed that contrary to speculations, there was no plan to absorb them into the military or other security agencies in the country.

According to him, the over 1,000 former Boko Haram

fighters can never be recruited due to stringent safeguards in place in the various security agencies.

Irabor spoke at the opening of Operation Safe Corridor stakeholders' meeting held at the Defence Headquarters, Abuja on Tuesday.

The CDS who was represented by the Chief of Defence Logistics, Major General Adeyemi Yekini, 1,000 persons, including 16 foreigners, have graduated

from the Deradicalisation. Rehabilitation and Reintegration Programme of OPSC and have been reintegrated.

He added that 559 others are currently going through the programme in Gombe State.

Irabor said, "There have been concerns that OPSC graduates are being recruited by the military and paramilitary agencies.

"I wish to clearly dispute this assertion and reassure Nigerians that none of the over 1,000 rehabilitated Nigerians from OPSC DRR have been recruited and will never be recruited into the Nigerian military or sister security services due to stringent safeguards in place to prevent such recruitment.

Today, this initiative has become a model that has been replicated in all the Lake Chad Basin Countries. It has also elicited the interest of both local and international bodies including academia."
