FRSC blames speeding as Ogun, Ondo highways'

TO fewer than 12 people lost their lives in two fatal accidents in Ogun and Ondo states on Tuesday.

At least four people were killed ter an 18-seater commercial bus rammed into a diesel-laden tanker around the Fidiwo, Ogun State end of the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway.

Twelve people were said to have been injured in the accident which occurred around gam

PUNCH Metro learnt that the tankerwas travelling outward Lagos State when some officials of the Federal Road Safety Corps from the Ogere command stopped the tanker and turned it back.

However, as the tanker was about

An eyewitness, who identified

the rescue operation. People that were there said FRSC officials were trying to stop the tanker and in the process of turning it back to their office in Ogere, the 18-seater bus, probably on speed, rammed into the tanker. As soon as the accident happened, the FRSC officials ran away instead of rescuing the victims.

"FRSC officials from Alapako took the survivors to a hospital. The driver and some other passengers at the backseat died on the spot."

denied that traffic officials caused the crash.

She said, "A total of 16 persons were involved, which comprised 13 male adults and three female adults. A total of 12 persons were injured nine male adults and three female adults. Unfortunately, four deaths were recorded from the crash, all male adults.

"The suspected causes of the crash are excessive speed and loss of control. It is not true that the accident was caused by FRSC officials: we were the ones that rescued the victims. The injured victims were taken to Victory Hospital, Ogere, and Idera Hospital, Sagamu, while the bodies of those killed were deposited at the FOS. Ipara."

"The lawyer there and then called them to come as the case was about to be settled.

"The duo of Nwafor Onvebuchi and Idakole Benjamin, who were later identified as dismissed police sergeants, then came around and they were arrested by the DPO and his men.

"On interrogation, the suspects confessed to blocking the expressway and hijacking the Blue Band loaded truck from the driver

in a crash along the Ondo-Ore Expressway at Bagbe, in the Ondo West Local Government Area of Ondo State.

It was gathered that the crash involved an 18-passenger Toyota Hiace with number plate, ARC 616 XA and a truck with no number plate.

An evewitness said the accident occurred when the bus driver attempted to overtake another vehicle, thereby colliding with the truck on the other lane.

The incident was said to have caused gridlock for several hours.

PUNCH Metro learnt that it took the intervention of men of the Federal Road Safety Corps, Ondo State, and the police before the road was deared.

An official of the FRSC, who spoke on condition of anonymity, said the accident was caused by speed limit violation and dangerous overtaking.

He said those who lost their lives had been taken to a mortuary, while the injured were taken to a hospital for treatment.

The state Police Public Relations Officer, Mrs Funmilayo Odunlami, confirmed the incident

She said, "The accident happened as a result of dangerous overtaking by the bus. It was a case of a headon-collision, as the bus collided with the truck. Eight passengers on the bus died on the spot, and five other people were injured. They have been taken to the Trauma Centre. Ondo, for treatment."
