Killings of seven in Imo cult-related, leader among jailbreakers

HE Commissioner of Police in Imo State, Rabiu Hussaini, has ordered the Deputy Commissioner of Police in charge of the State Criminal Investigation and Intelligence Department to go

after killers of seven community leaders in Nmahu, in the Ohaii-Egberna Local Government Area of the state.

A statement by the spokesperson for the command. Mike Abattam. on Wednesday, disclosed that the leader of the gang that killed the community leaders had been

identified.

The statement disclosed that the gang leader was one Ossy, who escaped from the Owerri Custodial Centre in 2021.

The statement read, "On February 8, around 10pm, one Ossy led about 20 armed men with their faces masked to

Mmaahu community in the Ohaii Egbema LGA of Imo State. They went to the houses of the following identified persons, Charles Mgbarahor, Funky Anane, Charity Nwachukwu, Edeme Okoro, Isaac Ojenya, Ndubuisi Nwabusi, and Junior Ifeyinwoke, and killed them.

"The Divisional Police Officer, on receipt of this information immediately mobilised his men and other patrol teams to the area. On arrival at the scene, the hoodlums had deserted the place. leaving seven persons dead.

destroying property worth millions of naira.

"The terrorists also took advantage of the absence of the military in the early hours of Tuesday at a checkpoint between Ungwan Wakili and Abuyab and vandalised the only bridge linking the two communities.

"As I am talking to you, not even a motorcycle can cross that bridge now. Something urgent needs to

be done in order to fix the bridge because the people those communities are living at the mercy of those terrorists," he added.
