Community blames govt as flood kills eight-year-old boy in Anambra

n eight-year-old boy, identified as
Chinwe, has been killed when a surging
flood flushed him into deep erosion.
The incident happened late on
Wednesday behind the school of
Nursing, Nkpor in the Idemili North Local
Government Area of Anambra State.

It was gathered that a combination of surging floods from the Immaculate Hearts Sisters Convent and Our Ladies Industrial Centre in Nkpor during rainfall swept the boy into the gully.

City Round gathered that the corpse was recovered the next day from about half a kilometre away from the spot where he plunged, with one of his hands broken.

The victim, who is a son of a vulcaniser in the area, was said to be returning from a journey with sign mother during a rainfall when the incident happened.

It was gathered that the boy, while approaching the gully from where he and his mother wanted to pass through to their home, ran faster than his mother, prompting her to shout for help.

His mother's shouts and calls for him to turn back fell on deaf ears, as he continued running until he reached the narrow part of the gully.

It was gathered that in an attempt to jump over

the gully, the surging flood swept his feet off and he plunged into it.

Some youths in the area were said to have prevented his mother with a baby strapped to her back in her attempt to jump into the gully to search for her son. The youth were said to have jumped into the gully in search of the victim but could not see him.

Eyewitnesses said that it was only the next morning that his corpse with one hand broken was found in the other side of the gully about a kilometre away from the spot where he plunged.

The bereaved mother, who could barely

talk to our correspondent about the incident, hired a vehicle which conveyed the corpse from Nkpor to their hometown.

People in the area blamed the state government for allowing the gully to expand from a minor hole to a big gully over the years instead of constructing a ring or box culvert to link the road to the streets.

A community member and ex-Chairman, Nigerian Bar Association, Idemili branch, Mr Samuel Chukwukelu, said successive governments in the state had abandoned the community because of the poor state of the roads.

Chukwukelu said the contractor who was

awarded the road project from Our Ladies Road through Uke Street to Attah Road linking Nkpor/ Umuoji Road, abandoned the project half way at the particular erosion prone area.

"The government neglected the Nkpor community in terms of developmental programmes. The death of the boy was unwarranted and unfortunate. If successive governments had done the needful, the incident would not have occurred," he said.

Contacted, the state police spokesman, DSP Tochukwu Ikenga, said the report had yet to be brought to his attention as of the time of filing the report.

Police begin investigation into N61m Katsina govt worker lost to robbers

he Katsina State Police Command has commenced investigation into Thursday's robbery in Katsina where a cashier in the office of the Secretary to the State Government was robbed of N61m by a two-member gang.

The command spokesman, SP Isah Gambo,

who confirmed the incident, said the command suspected "a conspiracy theory."

Eyewitnesses said the robbers on Thursday attacked the cashier, Aminu Darma, shortly after he withdrew the money from a commercial bank in the state capital and was returning to his office.

City Round further learnt that the cashier was shot in the hand and is currently receiving

treatment at the Katsina Teaching Hospital.

One of the eyewitnesses who spoke on condition of anonymity said, "The cashier had just withdrawn the money from the bank and was on his way to the office. Suddenly, he noticed that a car was trailing him and he decided to do a U- turn back to town at the Steel Rolling roundabout.

"At a point when the cashier had to slow down on approaching a junction where other
