

Lady nabbed for allegedly stabbing boyfriend to death

The Nasarawa State Police Command says it has arrested one Alice Mulak for stabbing her boyfriend to death in the Karu Local Government Area of the state.

The disclosure was made in a statement to *City Round* in Lafia on Friday by the state police spokesperson, DSP Ramhan Nansel.

The statement indicated, "Police operatives attached to Mararaba 'A' Division in Nasarawa State led by CSP

Musa Babayola have arrested one Alice Mulak 'F' of Ungwan Gwari, Karu LGA for stabbing her boyfriend to death with a knife.

"Preliminary investigation revealed that the incident happened behind City Rock Hotel, Mararaba at about 0330hrs when the deceased and his girlfriend engaged themselves in fisticuffs as a result of a misunderstanding. The suspect

was arrested and the knife used in perpetrating the offence was consequently recovered based on the directives of the Commissioner of Police, Adesina Soyemi."

Nansel added that the suspect had been transferred to the State Criminal Investigation and Intelligence Department, Lafia, for further investigation and subsequent prosecution.



Husband allegedly kills wife during argument over N10m

A man identified as Kelechukwu Onuka has been arrested by the men of the Ondo State Police Command for allegedly killing his wife. Onuka allegedly killed his wife over an argument on N10m at their residence in Aratunsi area of Oke Aro, Akure, Ondo State capital. The 42-year-old businessman was said to have accused his wife of hiding the money from him as they operated a joint business venture in Akure.

A source narrated that one of the deceased's family members who resides abroad sent her the N10m to assist in constructing a building for her. But the deceased, according to the source, did not inform her husband about the development.

The suspect, who learnt of the matter from another person, reportedly confronted the wife and an argument ensued between them.

The source said, "During the argument, the husband angrily hit his wife with a heavy object on the head and she fell and died instantly."

It was gathered that the matter was reported at a police station in Akure and the suspect was arrested. Reacting to the development, the state police spokesperson, Funmi Odunlami, on Friday confirmed the incident, adding that it was a case of domestic violence. She also confirmed the arrest of the suspect.

Odunlami said, "The suspect is already in the custody of the State Criminal Investigation and Intelligence Department while investigation into the incident has commenced."

Soludo laments killing of three vigilantes

The Anambra State governor, Chukwuma Soludo, has condemned the killing of three members of the Anambra State Vigilance Group, on official duty at Nkwo, Igboekwu, in the Aguata Local Government Area of the state.

In a statement in Awka on Friday, the governor's Press Secretary, Christian Aburime, gave the names of the victims as Okeke Emeka, Nnayeir Orizu and Chukwuma Ubaego.

The victims were killed when some yet-to-be-identified assailants opened fire on them on Wednesday.

Condemning the killings, the governor reiterated that those responsible for the killing of the three vigilantes would be fished out wherever they were to face justice.

The governor also reassured that the government was on the trail of those who attacked Senator Ifeanyi Ubah's convoy, where some of his orderlies and security details were killed and would soon be brought to face the full wrath of the law.

He commiserated with the families of the deceased and Igboekwu community, assuring that the death of the vigilantes would not be in vain.

He added, "This particular act of killing is inhuman and totally unacceptable. The perpetrators will surely not go scot-free as we are fully determined to fish them out to pay dearly for their crimes," he stressed.

Meanwhile, policemen attached to the Nteje Police Division have arrested about 15 suspected vandals stealing streetlight and electric cables at the Umueri Cargo Airport, Anambra State.

They were accused of vandalising electric cables, streetlights mounted at various locations at the airport.

Father, 39, arrested for impregnating 13-year-old daughter

Men of the Ogun State Police Command have arrested a 39-year-old man, Mfon Jeremiah, for allegedly impregnating his 13-year-old daughter (name withheld).

Jeremiah, a resident of FIRRO Estate off Adesan, Mowe in the Obafemi-Owode Local Government Area of Ogun State, was arrested after his wife reported him to the police.

The Police Public Relations Officer in the state, Abimbola Oyeyemi, made the disclosure in a statement on Friday. Oyeyemi said the suspect was arrested following a report

lodged at Mowe divisional headquarters by the mother of the victim.

The PPRO said, "The mother of the victim reported that she discovered that her daughter was pregnant, and when she inquired from the daughter, she was informed that it was her father who slept with her. The victim was taken to the hospital where it was confirmed that she is four months pregnant. Upon the report, the DPO Mowe division, SP Folake Afeniforo, quickly detailed detectives to the suspect's house where he was promptly arrested. On interrogation, the suspect confessed being responsible for his daughter's pregnancy, but claimed to be under a spell when he did it."



Seven traffic robbers arrested in Lagos

The Lagos State Police Command said on Friday that its men from the Ketu Division arrested seven traffic robbers who attacked a motorist.

City Round learnt that the suspects attacked the unidentified motorist at Kosofe bus stop along Ikorodu road, and were eventually arrested during a patrol by some of the police officers.

Details of the arrest and identities of the suspects were unavailable as of the time this report was filed. But the spokesperson for the state police command, Benjamin Hundeyin, said that the arrest of the five suspects led to the nabbing of two others.

Hundeyin said, "Yesterday, at about 1100hrs, five traffic robbers swooped on a motorist at Kosofe

bus stop along Ikorodu Road. Ketu Division's patrol team arrested them all, leading to the arrest of two others. Suspects range between 18 and 28 years. Investigation is ongoing."



Sexagenarian charged with drug trafficking

The National Drug Law Enforcement Agency on Friday charged a 64-year-old man, Lucky Osuya, with drug trafficking. The defendant is charged before a Federal High Court in Lagos.

The *News Agency of Nigeria* noted that the one-count charge is marked FHC/L/590C/2022. The NDLEA alleges that the defendant committed the offence on Sept. 18, at the Ikate area of Lagos State. It said that the defendant trafficked in 230g of cannabis.

According to the agency, cannabis, along with cocaine, heroin and other psychotropic substances are listed in the NDLEA Schedule as prohibited. Drug trafficking contravenes Section 11 (b) and 11(d) of the NDLEA Act of 2004. No date has been fixed for arraignment of the defendant.

Four arraigned for allegedly stealing firm's N1m equipment
