Benue: Nine killed, houses burnt

TO fewer than nine people were killed when rival local militias engaged in free for all at Atumbe, in Mbatyula council ward in Katsina-Ala Local Government Area of Benne State

Several houses reportedly burnt down during the three-day attack.

The incident, according to local sources happened Monday. and between Wednesday as the rival militias attacked themselves.

The source could not ascertain the actual cause of the attack but linked it to power play between the groups.

One of the locals said that the crisis started on Monday at Mbatyula council ward and spread to Mbayongo council ward in the same local government.

A local who did not want

to be mentioned and spoke to journalists in Makurdi through phone described it as a coordinated attacks.

He said, "A coordinated serial attacks were carried on in part of Mbatyula counc il ward by armed men suspected to be rival militia groups from Mbayongo council ward.

"On Tuesday, the armed men stormed Atumbe, a settlement in Mbatvula council ward set houses ablaze and made away with some properties.

"Same day, the group moved to Kur Hile, another settlement in Mbatyula where they also burnt some houses, the same thing happened at Anyom settlement still in Mbatyula council ward on Wednesday 17/1/2024 where seven people were killed.and several houses burnt to ashes.

Another resident said that Mbayongo council ward is the birth place of the slain terrorist
