Netizens mourn presenter killed in Abuja auto crash

TETIZENS have expressed sadness over the death of a radio presenter, Deborah Ohamara, who was involved in a multiple crash on Monday along the Airport Road in Lugbe, Abuja.

Her death was announced in a statement issued by the General Manager, Nigeria Info FM, Olufemi Obong-Daniels, on Tuesday

Deborah was a host and staff member on Sunny Side on Nigeria Info 95.1 FM in Abuja.

According to the statement, the presenter passed away on Monday, January 15, 2024, in Abuja from complications following a deadly car accident involving her car and a truck on Airport Road.

injured to UNIOSUN Teaching Hospital, Osogbo for treatment. Corpses of those that died were deposited at the morgue of the State Specialist Hospital, Asubiaro, Osogbo."

When contacted, the Osun State Police Command Public Relations Officer, Yemisi Opalola, though confirmed the incident, could not immediately give specific number of the robbers that were killed.

She said, "I am yet to get a full briefing on the incident. We were told the robbers came in large number and engaged the hunters. Police later mobilised to the scene and they were subdued. I don't have the number of those that died yet."

He added, "The Management and Staff of Info FM Limited, owners of Nigeria Info FM, sadly announce the unfortunate demise of Deborah Ohamara, which occurred on Monday, January 15, 2024. Until her unfortunate demise, Ms Ohamara, fondly called Debbie, was a staff and host of Sunny Side on Nigeria Info 95.1 in Abuja.

"Debbie died from complications resulting from a fatal car accident involving her vehicle and a truck on Saturday, January 13, 2024, along Airport Road in Abuja.

He added that the medical experts at the National Hospital abruptly declared her condition critical, noting that all attempts to save her life there were unsuccessful.

"Attempts to save her life at the National Hospital proved abortive as her condition was unexpectedly pronounced eritical on Monday by the medical team.

Reacting, a fellow broadcaster @Blkimberly mourned the deceased on the X platform describing her as a dear friend and colleague.

She wrote, "Good night to a dear friend and colleague Deborah Ohamara. I call her Debs, and she loves the sound of it. The sun has set for her here on earth, but i believe she is basking in the glorious light of Heaven. Rest in peace, sis. I will miss you soooo much."

Also, @NnabaFrank wrote, "This is more than heartbreaking. Debbie was my favourite amongst all the OAPs of Nigeria Info FM Abuja. I returned to Abuja yesterday and tuned in today when Swat was talking about her accident. It's sad that she didn't get out of it. Rest on Debbie

Another user @SESLO_ONEuji wrote, "Hearing her demise really shocked me. I used to follow her very well on her radio show. Very entertaining and golden voice with a soft mind to take anybody's opinions no matter what. Kai!! Debby is really a nice radio presenter."
