Police nab manager, invite doctor over Rivers graduate's death

THE Rivers State Police
Command has confirmed
the arrest of the manager of
Paragon Clinics and Imaging
Diagnosis, a private health
facility located along Stadium
Road in Port Harcourt

The police said the arrest was part of the investigations following the report of the death of a first class graduate of Microbiology from Benson

Idahosa University, Benin Čity, Edo State, identified as Rebekah Tamunotorukubu Sekidika at the hospital.

The deceased's father, said to be an employee of the Nigerian Liquefied Natural Gas in Port Harcourt.

Sampson Sekidika, had told PUNCH Metro that his daughter died during a procedure at the hospital on February 2, 2024.

Sekidika alleged that

negligence and incompetence
of those who performed the
procedure on his 24-year-old
daughter which he said did
not require a surgery led to her
death and called for justice.

While noting that he personally drove Rebekah to the facility on the said day, he insisted that she was healthy and without any medical condition, but needed to carry out a test following delayed menstruation before

embarking on a foreign trip.

The spokesperson for the state police command, Grace Iringe-Koko, confirmed the arrest of the manager to our correspondent on Sunday.

Iringe-Koko expressed dismay that an earlier invitation by the police for the doctor and the person who administered the anaesthetic was not honoured.

She stated, "Yes, I can confirm that the manager has

been arrested. And we have also invited the doctor and one other person as part of our investigations.

"The matter has been transferred to the State Criminal Investigation and Intelligence Department for proper investigation."

The PPRO further said two others who were also arrested had been released because their duties at the facility had no direct link with the incident.
