

Abiodun mourns as ex-aide dies in auto crash

THE Governor of Ogun State, Dapo Abiodun, on Tuesday, mourned the death of his former Special Adviser on Vocational and Technical Education, Prof. Joseph Odemuyiwa, describing it as a great loss to the state and the education sector.

Odemuyiwa reportedly died in an auto crash on Tuesday.

The 66-year-old don was said to be travelling to Lead City University, Ibadan, Oyo State capital, where he was a lecturer, when the fatal accident happened.

Abiodun, in a condolence message, described Odemuyiwa's death as tragic and sad.

He said the erstwhile special adviser was a team player who contributed immensely to the success recorded by his administration in vocational and technical education during his first term in office.
