Police hunt man who killed apprentice with shovel

THE Lagos State Police
Command has launched
a manhunt for a middleaged man identified simply
Olumide after he allegedly
beat his apprentice, Adeyemi,
to death in the Alagbado area
of the state.

Olumide was said to have hit the 19-year-old deceased with a shovel on the head while punishing him for an offence.

Adeyemi however succumbed to the injury sustained from the impact of the shovel attack.

The state Police Public Relations Officer, SP Benjamin Hundeyin, confirmed the incident on



•Lagos PPRO, Hundeyin Thursday.

Hundeyin said that the Alagbado Police Division received a report of the alleged crime on Tuesday.

He said, "At about 12.00 p.m. on July 5, at about 2.00 p.m., one Olumide gave his

son, Adeyemi, a deep cut under moderate correction, at his right hand side with a shovel over an undisclosed offence."

"The young man was immediately rushed to the hospital for treatment. But when the injury became serious, he was taken to the General Hospital Ikeja, where he gave up the ghost as a result of tetanus infection, as confirmed by the doctor on duty."

He said detectives of the division visited the scene.

"However, the father of the victim is currently at large and the case is under investigation," he added.

reported that a 70-year-old man, Theophilus Udeh, is in the police net for killing his son over food in Eziama Lokpaukwu in Umunneochi Local Government Area of Abia State.

Sources disclosed that Udeh who did not eat his food in the morning came back home to eat the food only to discover that the deceased had returned home hungrily earlier and eaten the last portion in a pot inside the kitchen, unknown to him that it was his father's meal.

This, however, angered the suspect who dashed into his room, brought out his gun and fired at his son, killing him.
