Musa called on the security agencies to fashion out new measures to provide more security within the Madagali Local Government Area, pointing out that the residents no longer have any escape routes in case of any attack by the insurgents.

However, the LGA boss said that the governor sent five trucks of food stuffs and non-consumables materials for distribution to the victims of the flood.

When *Arewa PUNCH* visited the affected communities on Saturday, our correspondent noted that among the worst hit villages by the flood are Governor Ahmadu Fintiri's village in Kirchinga, Shuwa, Mildu, Mayo-wandu, Shuware, Pambla, Jihili and Palam.

Deeply devastated by the sad situation, Fintiri called on the Federal Government to intervene and ensure that the affected persons get the necessary assistance to cushion their suffering.

The governor, who was represented by his deputy, Professor Kaletapwa Farauta, while delivering the items, advised the victims to move to higher dry lands, pointing out that the heavy down will continue for a while.

"I think it is only proper for people that are settling along water ways to relocate, not only in Madagali local government, but the entire state. There are strong signals that there will be heavy downpour this year based on Nimet's predictions," he said.

In his assessment of the Madagali Local Government flood, the Head of Operations, Yola office of the National Emergency Management Agency, Mr. Ayuba Ladan said that over 10,000 people were displaced, and ten others injured during the sad incident.

Ladan said that the Madagali Local Government, in collaboration with the Nigeria Red Cross, has established eight Internally Displaced Person's camps to cater to the well-being of the survivors.
