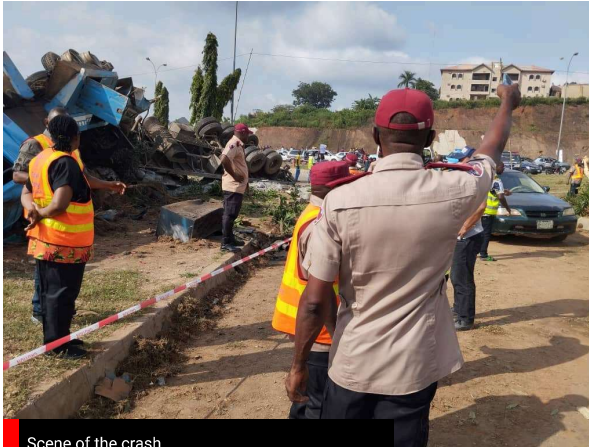


## Two die in Abia car crash

The Federal Road Safety Corps, Abia Sector Command, has confirmed the death of two people in a road accident which occurred on the Umuahia-Enugu Expressway.

According to the News Agency of Nigeria, the Sector Commander, Mrs Ngozi Ezeoma, disclosed this in a statement on Friday in Umuahia, adding that the accident, which occurred at 3:50 pm at Ohiya, also left 12 people injured.

Ezeoma said, "The crash involved a blue Toyota commercial bus and resulted in the loss of two lives, while 12 other persons sustained injuries. The crash involved 10 male adults and four female adults, with one male adult confirmed dead on the spot.

"The injured victims were rushed to the nearest hospital for treatment, while the deceased was taken to the mortuary by the FRSC rescue team that arrived at the scene within 10 minutes of notice.
