

One killed as tricycle crashes into stationary truck in Ogun

A man whose identity was yet to be known lost his life after a tricycle rammed into a stationary truck along the Ikorodu-Sagamu Expressway on Wednesday.

PUNCH Metro learnt this from a traffic update by the Ogun State Traffic Compliance and Enforcement Agency spokesperson, Babatunde Akinbiyi, on Thursday.

Akinbiyi noted that the stationary truck had parked along the roadside to offload goods to a nearby shop before the tricycle rammed into it.

He said, “A fatal road crash occurred at Adron Homes and Properties office, beside the TRACE office in Ogijo, along the Sagamu-Ikorodu Expressway.

“On an eyewitness account, the accident was caused due to a hazardous parking of the Dayun truck that was waiting for a very long time to offload its goods in some of the shops around the accident scene before the tricycle and didn’t notice the stationed vehicle, rammed under it from the back.

“Three males were involved. One male is dead and one male is injured.”

The TRACE PRO noted that the injured victim was taken to a nearby hospital while the deceased victim was handed over to his family.

“The injured victim was taken to Ikorodu General Hospital by the Police Ogijo before our arrival and the dead body was taken away by the family in the presence of the police.”

He identified the vehicles involved as a Dayun Truck with the number plate KJA 874 XW and a TVS tricycle with the number plate EPE 617 QN.

PUNCH Metro reported on April 19 that two separate accidents that happened on Easter Saturday along the Oru/Ijebu-Igbo Road and Sagamu-Ikorodu Expressway in Ogun State left four people dead.

Akinbiyi, in separate traffic updates, noted that the first accident along the Oru/Ijebu-Igbo Road occurred at about 7 a.m. at the Odorasanyin area near the VIO office in Ijebu-Igbo, while the second accident occurred at Gbara village along the Sagamu-Ikorodu Expressway, and left one person dead.
