EAR has gripped residents of some parts of Bavelsa metropolis as gunmen suspected to be cultists unleashed terror in the adjoining communities. killing and maiming innocent citizens in area.

Our correspondent reports that the raging cult war has paralyzed social activities in the communities as people now desert the streets while traders closed their shops by the rampaging cultists.

According to sources, one of the victims in the Famgbe

attack popularly known as "Today Today" was outside a wheelbarrow escaped with smoking cigarettes when bullet wounds. he sighted a group of boys moving towards his direction.

A community source who spoke on condition of anonymity added he decided to run for his life but the bullet hit him in the process as he escaped with the bullet wound to his house adding that the cultists followed the trace of blood to his house where he was hiding, broke in and killed him.

The source told South-South Punch that before last Saturday's attack, one Iniye, a known cultist had been killed on Sunday, May 11.

It was gathered that at Ogu. the victim was said to have seen a group of cultists armed with dangerous weapons entering the community and he warned other residents to go into their homes for safety.

However, he later went out to urinate and he was shot on the abdomen, and his sister who rushed outside on hearing his cry of anguish,

was shot on her breasts, but survived.

At Swali, Ogu, Akaba Obogoro, Famgbe and Obele areas of Yenagoa, it was gathered that shop owners now close early for fear of being attack by the cultists. At the Swali Ultra-Modern Market, one of the security

men who was once a cultist was shot and killed last weekend as the cult war intensified.

On Monday, at about 6.00pm at the Swali Ultra-Modern Market, a group of cultists armed with AK-47 entered and shot through the door of one shops. There was however no casualty.

- Traders along Harbour Road close to the market had to close their shops earlier around 8.00pm because of the sound of gunshots from the slaughter area of the market.

Last weekend, the shooting at the Obele area was so intense that vehicles plying through the area had to look for alternative routes, according to an eyewitness.
