A road crash that occurred along the Mountain Top University area of the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway has claimed two lives.

This is coming barely 24 hours after two people were killed in three separate accidents in different parts of Ogun State.

PUNCH Metro learnt on Wednesday from a traffic update by the Ogun State Traffic Compliance and Enforcement Agency that the accident occurred at about 9 p.m. on Tuesday.

According to the update, the accident involved a white Hiace bus with the number plate AGL 54 XU and an unregistered truck.

The update noted that the accident happened due to excessive speeding on the part of the Hiace bus driver, who rammed into the truck.

The update read, “A fatal road traffic accident at Mountain Top University along the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway on 16/9/2025.

The time of the accident is 20:55 hours. It involves a white Hiace bus with the number plate AGL 54 XU and an unregistered truck.

The cause of the RTA was that the driver of the Hiace bus rammed into an unknown moving truck from the rear due to his excessive speed and loss of control. In the process, the unknown truck ran away.”

It added that 12 people, including seven males and five females, were involved, two people were injured, and two people died.

“The number of occupants involved was 12 (seven males and five females). The number of injured is two (one male, one female), while the number of deaths is two (one male, one female).

“The road was cordoned off to a single lane to clear the crash. The presumed dead bodies have been deposited at the Ogun State University Teaching Hospital morgue, Sagamu.

“However, the injured victims were taken to the AZ Hospital in Magboro by FRSC before our arrival,” the update read.

PUNCH Metro reported on Wednesday that two people lost their lives in three road crashes that occurred along the Abeokuta-Sagamu Expressway and the Ijebu-Benin Expressway.

The spokesperson for the Ogun State Traffic Compliance and Enforcement Agency, Babatunde Akinbiyi, who confirmed the incident, added that three people sustained varying degrees of injuries in the road crashes, which were blamed on speeding and dangerous driving.
