4 Killed In Ojuelegba

Ojuelegba in Surulere was yesterday turned into a war zone as factions of the Road Transport Employers Association of Nigeria (RTEAN), engaged themselves in a bloody clash in a bid to claim supremacy of the Ojuelegba Roundabout motor park, leaving four people dead and many people injured.

The fighting, which started very early on Sunday, saw thugs

of a faction of the transport association weilding guns, axes, matchetes and other dangerous weapons and stormed the park in a bid to take over the running of the association from the incumbent chairman.

The expelled chairman, in a reprisal effort, returned to the park with over 20 buses full of touts and thugs, to reclaim the park and a bloody war ensued.

The arrival of mobile police in an armoured truck did not deter the warring parties until they began to shoot sporadically,
