2 Workers Die Inside Tunnel

Two men trapped in an underground tunnel were brought out dead yesterday amidst wailing and tears by a combined team of men from the Lagos State Emergency Management Agency, Traffic Management Authority, Lagos State Ambulance Services, Nigeria Police from Denton Station and Messrs. Julius Berger Nigeria Plc.

The incident happened at Coates Street/Borno Way, Ebute

Metta, Lagos.

P.M.News gathered that the deceased may have suffocated to death while in the tunnel. Eyewitnesses who spoke with P.M.News said the victims were contracted, along with two others, by the street traders in the area to clear the drainage and ease the flow of water that had flooded the area. The four-man group was the third to be given the job.

As soon as the two deceased entered the tunnel, they complained of excessive heat, but still went on with the job.

After some minutes, nothing was heard from them, which made the two others raise an alarm.

Shuaib Lawan, who was one of the labourers told P.M.News that he made an effort to enter the tunnel and to look for them, but

had to back out because the heat was unbearable.

Reacting to the incident, Executive Secretary, Lagos Mainland Local Government, Olukemi Banjo, said the council went into action as soon as the information about the incident reached them. They called Julius Berger for a private compressor.

While stating that the victims entered the tunnel without seeking and obtaining approval from the council, Banjo stated that it was not the duty of the local council to clear blocked tunnels as there is a state agency responsible for that.

He, however, blamed the traders who engage in street
