The accused person was also alleged to have driven in a dangerous manner and caused injuries to Deborah Williams, Bolanle Sanusi, David Sanusi, Damilola Sanusi, Esther Sanusi and Boluwaji Tolu Oscar.

The offence was alleged to have been committed on 2 September, 2007, at about 1700 hrs

at Awori Bus Stop, along Abeokuta/Lagos Expressway in the Ikeja Magisterial District.

The accused pleaded not guilty to the five-count charge levelled against him, while the prosecutor, Inspector Martins Young, informed the court that the accused did not have a driving licence when asked to produce it.

Counsel to the accused, Bunmi Ayodele, pleaded that her client be granted bail in a liberal term.

The presiding magistrate, Mrs. B. Osunyemi, refused to grant the accused bail, while the matter was adjourned till 24 September, 2007.
