

Truck Kills Woman

Tragedy struck at **Sango, Ogun State, near the uncompleted overhead bridge at the weekend when a truck with registration number XN 318 APP crushed a mother of four, identified as a roadside palm oil seller, instantly.**

P.M.News learnt that the accident occurred around 2 p.m. when the deceased, Mrs. Mary, was watching over her goods and the truck veered to where she was sitting and killed her.

It was gathered that a commercial motorcyclist, popularly called *Okada* and a student of Olabisi Onabanjo University (OOU), Ago-Iwoye were seriously injured in the accident. When *P.M.News* got to the private hospital where the victims were taken to, a nurse disclosed that the victims had been rushed to the Ota General Hospital.

Mr. Wale Olokede, Divi-

sional Police Officer, Sango Command who quickly sent his men to the scene of the incident, told *P.M.News*: "We are always on ground for any distress call. We have been warning traders to desist from selling on the road and any trader caught selling by the roadside would be made to face the wrath of the law."

A resident of Sango, Mr. Aworemi Olawale, told *P.M.News* that due to the ongoing construction of the overhead bridge, roadside sellers have taken over all the roads to display their wares, thereby causing traffic jams daily.

He call on the chairman of the caretaker committee of Ado-Odo Local Government and the Ogun State government to find a lasting solution to the problem.

"We face hell on this road everyday and government has to do something about this," another resident told *P.M.News*.
