# Robbers Kill 4 Policemen

In a daring operation carried out in broad daylight in Lagos, dare-devil armed robbers gunned down four po-

licemen and snatched the salary of staff of a company located at 13, Fatai Atere Road, Matori, Isolo.

The slain policemen attached to Mushin Police Station, Olosan were said to be escorting

a van carrying the salary of staff of FCML to the company on Monday when they were attacked.

A source at Olosan police station Mushin, however, confirmed that only two

policemen died in the attack while two others are in critical condition at the Lagos University Teaching Hospital LUTH Idi-Araba, Lagos.

Investigations also revealed that an insider in the company

gave the robbers information about the company's money withdrawn from the bank on the day of the attack.

P.M. News investigations revealed that the robbers followed

the cops and officials of the company to the bank where the money was withdrawn and later attacked them as they made their way into the company.

It was learnt that the money snatched by the robbers was meant to pay the two-month salary of workers of the company.

Eyewitnesses told *P.M.News* that the bodies of the slain policemen were taken to the Lagos University Teaching Hospital (LUTH), Idi-Araba where they are currently being kept, until their relations are contacted.

One of the deceased was said to be sitting under the tree near the company when the robbers arrived and asked everybody to lie face down. He was said to have been shot at close range.

The DPO of Olosan Police Station, CSP E.F. Fajuyigbe described the incident as tragic and vowed to fish out the criminals.

Meanwhile, And in their bid to escape after attacking motorists along Ikorodu Road on Sunday, armed robbers shot a 16-year old boy, Ayodeji Awosanya.

The teenager who lives at 3, Adenekan Street, Fadeyi, was said to have been hit by a bullet fired by the robbers while trying to escape.

The injured teenager is now receiving treatment at the emergency ward of the military hospital, Yaba.

Explaining the circumstances that led to Ayodeji being shot, his brother, Paul, said: "Deji was in front of the house with
