

Trader Stabbed To Death Over Super Eagles Match

Tragedy struck at Jakande Estate, Oke Afa, Ejigbo, Lagos when a spare parts dealer, Ifeanyi Obi, was stabbed to death by a neighbour simply identified as Onyeka during argument over Super Eagles ability to reach the final of the just concluded Africa Cup of Nations.

The 28-year old Ifeanyi was allegedly stabbed to death by Onyeka with a broken bottle on the day Super Eagles dazed Mozambique 3-0. The brawl took place in a video club in the area. The incident has thrown residents into mourning while youths have fled their homes to avoid police arrest. The video club where the incident occurred has also been shut down.

When *P.M.NEWS* visited the deceased's residence at Plot 20, Furniture Street, Jakande Estate, Ejigbo, his apartment was under lock and key. Sympathisers gathered around the house to mourn him.

A lady simply called Cynthia told *P.M.NEWS* that the deceased was his brother and that his body has been deposited

at the mortuary at Isolo General Hospital, Lagos, pending the conclusion of police investigation into the death.

At the Ejigbo Police Station,

the DPO was not around to comment on the matter and efforts to speak with the DCO proved abortive, as he referred *P.M.NEWS* to the police PRO.

A source at the station told *P.M.NEWS* that some arrests had been made and the matter has been transferred to SCID, Panti, Yaba for further investigation.

Fashola's Supporters Reply Group

Founding Chairman of Lovers of Raji Fashola (LORAF), Bishop Abiodun Olugbenro, has alerted Lagosians on the activities of a group, True Face of Lagos, which it accused of trying to cause confusion in Lagos through its advertorials.

Bishop Olugbenro, in an interview with *P.M.NEWS*, described the group as faceless and warned Lagosians to be wary of its activities.

True Face of Lagos had in an advertorial in a national newspaper last week, levelled some unwholesome allegations against Governor Babatunde

Fashola.

Reacting to the allegations, LORAF chairman, Bishop Olugbenro described them as distractions meant to make Fashola lose focus of turning Lagos into a mega city.

"As far as we are concerned, the group, True Face of Lagos, is a faceless group and Lagosians should be wary of its activities.

"Immediately we saw the advertisement in the paper, we wanted to know those behind it and we discovered that the names written at the bottom of the advertisement were not prominent names in the Lagos political circles.

"Fashola is doing fantastic job in Lagos and everybody can attest to it. The general opinion

among Lagosians is that Fashola is performing. If you take a bus ride and ask people of the performance of Fashola, they will tell you that he is performing.

"Nobody doubts the fact that Fashola is changing the face of Lagos positively and everybody appreciate his efforts. Even lawmakers in the Lagos House of Assembly are full of praises for Fashola.

"The group, True Face of Lagos, is a faceless group and it should not be taken serious. They are not the true face of Lagos but a false face.

"We have to reply them because they are trying to turn the facts upside down. Lagos has never had it so good. The so-called True Face of Lagos are the enemies of the people and time will soon expose them. They are jokers and liars," Bishop Olugbenro stated.
