

London Publisher, Bayo Gbadebo Dies In Auto Crash

Prince Bayo Gbadebo, the Publisher of Prime Magazine, a London-based celebrity glossy publication and popular socialite, is dead.

He died following a fatal road accident, which occurred in the evening of Saturday, June 19, in Iyaganku, Ibadan, Oyo State. Eye witness account disclosed that the socialite died when a trailer lost control and rammed into his car.

Gbadebo was reported to have died instantly in the accident.

The news of his death, which broke out few minutes after the crash, sent shock waves across many cities, especially London, where he made his mark as a social activist and businessman.

His media organisation, Prime News International, publishes Prime Social Magazine, a well circulated celebrity magazine in London.

It was gathered that Gbadebo had recently relocated to Nigeria, after living in England for 20 years. Two weeks ago, he had visited his family in London and had returned to his Ibadan base few days before his death.

Born in January 1964, Prince Gbadebo hailed from one of the Royal families in Igbajo, Osun State. He attended African

'If only I had teeth down down there' said Ehlers. 'I promised her I'd do something to help people like her one day.'

True to her word, Rape-Axe has jagged teeth-like hooks that latch onto a man's penis during penetration.

Once its in place, it can only be removed by a doctor - a procedure Ehlers hopes will be done with authorities on standby to make an arrest.

'It hurts, he cannot pee and walk when it's on,' she said. 'If he tries to remove it, it will clasp even tighter... however, it doesn't break the skin, and there's no danger of fluid exposure.'

opment steps before launching the product.

'I consulted engineers, gynecologists and psychologists to help in the design and make sure it was safe,' she said.

Once the trial period is over, they'll be available for about £1.50 each.

"The ideal situation would be for a woman to wear this when she's going out on some kind of blind date... or to an area she's not comfortable with," Ehlers added.

However critics believe the female condom makes women vulnerable to more violence from men trapped by the device.

It's also a form of 'enslavement,' said Victoria Kajja, a fellow for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in the east African country of Uganda.

"The fears surrounding the victim, the act of wearing the condom in anticipation of being assaulted all represent enslavement that no woman should be subjected to."

South Africa has one of the highest rape rates in the world, according to Human Rights Watch.

A 2009 report by the nation's Medical Research Council found that 28 percent of men surveyed had raped a woman or girl, with one in 20 saying they had raped in the past year. It is also believed that 16 percent of the population is living with HIV.

Women take drastic measures to prevent rape in South Africa, Ehlers said, with some inserting razor blades in their private parts.
