

Mosque Minaret Tragedy Mad Woman Pushes Rescuer To Death

Tragedy struck at Odo-Olowu Street, Ijesha, Lagos this morning as a woman suspected to be mentally deranged pushed a man down from a three-storey mosque minaret.

The man known as Innocent, died on the spot.

identified as Remilekun Ayanlowo, a mother of three, when the incident occurred.

P.M.NEWS gathered that Remilekun had climbed the minaret and in a bid to rescue her, she pushed Innocent, who fell and died on the spot.

Nobody could explain why she climbed the minaret and refused to come down in spite of all entreaties.

The case has been reported at the Ijesha Police Station, Ijesha-Tedo, Lagos.

Confirming the incident to P.M.NEWS, the DPO of Ijesha Police Station said the father of Remilekun has been arrested and his men are currently interrogating him.

Investigation revealed that the deranged woman was brought down by fire brigade personnel and was taken to Ijesha market.

The husband has two wives. It was gathered that the deranged woman resides at No. 5, Jimoh Agunbiade Street, Ijesha, Lagos.

Edo Assembly Approves Budget

The Edo State House of Assembly has formally passed the 2011 Appropriation bill into law.

The bill was presented to the House by the state Governor Adams Oshiomhole for deliberation and approval.

The 2011 Appropriation bill estimate which was originally

pegged at N105.63 billion was increased to N112,727 billion.

The Speaker, Rt. Hon. Bright Omokhion, said during the plenary session that out of a budget of N112,727,407,765 billion approved, N68,810,662 billion has been earmarked for capital expenditure while the recurrent expenditure will gulp N43,904,326,103 for the fiscal year.

They also prayed that INEC and PDP be restrained from announcing or making any pronouncement validating the results of the primaries/congresses conducted in Ogun State pending the hearing of the originating summons.

Herdsmen Kill 3 Farmers

A clash between Fulani herdsmen and farmers, mostly youths in Asang Eniong village in Odukpani Local Government Area of Cross River State has resulted in the death of three of the farmers.

The herdsmen engaged the youths of the village in a fight Tuesday when the youths told them to vacate their farmland where the herdsmen were grazing their cattle.

"We asked them to vacate the land as their cattle were destroying our crops but they refused. Rather, they engaged us in a fight with machetes and killed three of our members," Etcheri Okokon, a youth leader in the village, told P.M.NEWS.

The youth leader gave the names of those killed as: Samuel Ekanem, Ededem John and Idarete Okon.

"The late Samuel was our youth leader. He had seven children. He led us to meet Alhaji Bature the head of the cattle rearers. But when we got there Bature asked Fulani peo-

ple to attack us with machetes," Okokon alleged.

He stated that the cattle rearers went ahead to ransack their village, causing them to flee their homes.

He claimed that the police sent to the village did not arrest the herdsmen.

Woman Disappears On Her Way To Register

A woman in Ipaja town in Ayobo-Ipaja Local Council Development Area, LCDA, of Lagos State, Nigeria, Olukemi Gbelee, has been reported missing.

She was on her way to a registration centre in the area.

According to a police report, Olukemi's sister, Omotayo Gbelee reported that on 25 January, her sister left their 56, Candos Road, Barawa Ipaja residence to go and register.

Omotayo said since then, Olukemi Gbelee has not returned home and nobody knows her whereabouts.

Officer, Cross River State Police Command, ASP Etim Dickson said he was not aware of the incident.

However, another police source said eleven armed policemen have been drafted to the place and advised the fleeing villagers to return to their homes.

The incident was reported at the Ipaja Police State. A Woman sergeant, Evelyn Famogbiyele was assigned to investigate the incident.
