A Lagos businessman, Onye-buchi Onuoha, 48, has been cooling his feet in the cell of the

State Criminal Investigation Department, SCID, Panti, Yaba, Lagos after he was arrested for allegedly kill-

ing his 13-year old brother, John Iroh Udeh.

PMNEWS investigations revealed that the act was allegedly committed at their 19,

Ajasa Street, Olodi Apapa, Lagos, Southwest Nigeria. It was gathered that Onye-buchi had complained to his friends that he was facing a lot of challenges in his busi-ness after it nosedived. He reportedly told his colleagues

reportedly told his colleagues that he was now frustrated.

On the day of the alleged murder, neighbours suspected Onyebuchi's movement and demanded to search a bag he was carrying just as he was about leaving his residence to an unknown destination.

The curious neighbours were shocked to discover the body of murdered John cut into three parts and hidden inside the sack.

Onyebuchi was promptly arrested and handed over to the nearest police station.

With no contenders to throw a challenge for the post, the assembly approved the new term by consensus. Ban declared his candidature two weeks ago and received the formal backing by the powerful 15-member UN Security Council on Friday. All regional groups at the UN also endorsed him:

Area Boys Arrested

The Lagos State Taskforce on Environment and Special Offences (Enforcement Unit) stormed Mile 12 area of Lagos, South West Nige-ria on Tuesday and arrested 19 suspected area boys as they were smoking Indian hemp at a joint in the area.

The arrest of the area boys is sequel to the declaration of zero tolerance for their activities in the state by the Lagos State Government.

Officials of the taskforce acted on a tip off that some street urchins had been tormenting people in the area and that they were being harboured at an Indian hemp joint at Mile 12 area.

Armed policemen swung into action and arrested the 19 area boys who were caught smoking in the early hours of

Chairman, Lagos Taskforce, Supol Bayo Sulaiman, when contacted, told P.M.NEWS that the state government had declared zero tolerance for area boys, saying that it was no longer business as usual.

According to him, with the declaration of zero tolerance for area boys.

for area boys, the taskforce would now arrest street urchins anywhere they are found as some of them pose security threat to the society.

Sulaiman told PM NEWS
that the suspected area boys would be charged to court to-

day.

He disclosed that the crackdown on area boys would be a continuous exercise and warned other street urchins to beware as the taskforce could come any time and unan-nounced to arrest them.

"Miscreants should stay yay from Lagos because away we have begun massive enforcement of the law to arrest them," he warned.

She expressed worry at the rate at which miscreants and armed robbers are taking advantage of the situation along the axis to dispossess commuters, drivers and residents of their personal belongings.

Contributing to the call, a lawmaker, Sultan Adeniji-Adele, said the expressway which also leads to his constituency has been hijacked by military men.

"Most of the time, they drive against traffic on the road with the belief that no one can stop them," he said.

According to the Deputy Speaker, Taiwo Kolawole, "most of the problems on that road are caused by people. At Iba Bus Stop, those traders are not making use of the model market, but they instead come to the main road to display and sell their wares.

"Many of the bus drivers don't make use of the parks and LASTMA officials are also becoming another threat, because they now collect money like common traffic wardens.'

The House then called on all law enforcement agents in the state including the Lagos State Traffic Management Authority (LASTMA), the Traffic Division of the Nigerian Police, Badagry Division to urgently resolve the traffic crisis along the expressway.

Police Evacuate Seized Vehicles From Stations

The Lagos State Police Command has carried out the instruction given by the Inspector General of Police, IGP, Mr. Hafiz Ringim, to evacuate all accidented and impounded vehicles at all the police formations in the state

When P.M.NEWS visited Police Command, Ikeja Area 'G' Ogba, Elere Police Station, Alausa, Alakuko, Idimu, Makinde, Oko-Oba and Area F, Oko-Odo Divisions, this morning it is observed that the vehicles have been evacuated

in compliance with the order given by the IGP.

Dependable police sources revealed that the force needs intelligence network and pro-vision of latest bomb detectors and equipment to enable the police detect bombs and prevent crimes before they are committed.

"The police have no capaci-ty to provide security. There is no available bomb detector in the country and no Inspector General of Police is willing to address this issue because of corruption. The authorities should allocate money to procure bomb detectors and train policemen," a source said
