A police source said the robbers were on an operation when residents sent a distress call to the police at about mid-

night on Saturday.
Acting on the information, the Divisional Police Officer, DPO, for Orile, SP Robinson Erbghare led his men to the scene of the crime.

The robbers reportedly opened fire on the police who also engaged the tour-man gang in a gun battle that lasted

some minutes. At the end of the encounter, one of the robbers was shot dead but the other three man-

The corpse of the robber has been deposited at the Isolo General Hospital, mortuary for autopsy.

the police station, the DPO was not available to comment on the incident. But a police source confirmed the incident and added that the police have organised a manhunt for the fleeing robbers.
