Lagos Flood Sweeps Away Man, Daughter, 3 Others

A 63-year old retired soldier, Akpata Daniel and his 16-year old daughter, Seun are among the five residents that were swept away by flood at Aboru, Iyana Ipaja, Lagos, Southwest Nigeria.

The tragedy was caused by the heavy rain that fell in some parts of the state on to have slipped into the canal while trying to Wednesday.

Many other residents of the area were also displaced by the flood with no hope of where

to lay their heads.

The victims were reported to have been swept into a canal from three adjoining streets - Alabede, Akinola and Raji Rasaki in Oke-Odo area of Agbado Oke-Odo Local Council Development Area, at about 6.20 p.m. The other three victims are yet to be identified.

The late Akpata and his daughter were said navigate their way through the heavy flood

for allegedly drugging and raping a female student (name withheld) on campus.



The parents of the victim insisted that their daughter was killed by the pastor due to the poisonous substance she drank.

They argued that it was not the popular anointing oil often used for deliverance as claimed by the pastor, otherwise their daughter would not have died.

The matter was reported at the Oke-Ira Police Station and the pastor was arrested while the matter was transferred State Criminal Investigation Department, Panti, Yaba, Lagos where he was interrogated before being charged to court.

he police alleged that the offence he committed was contrary to Section 221 of the Criminal Code Law of Lagos State of Nigeria 2011. He pleaded not guilty and the

presiding magistrate granted him bail in the sum of N1 million with two sureties who must own a landed property in Lagos State.

would be fined N250, 000 while commercial bus drivers without certification would be fined N50 000

According to Opeifa, the state government had been sensitising commuter bus drivers and others on the need to get certified by LASDRI for the past two years, saying that government was now ready to enforce the no certification, no driving law in Lagos State.

The commissioner stated that professional drivers must be certified by the institute on yearly basis, saying that the drivers would be trained and tested for a day and that if they passed, they would be issued certificate

of competency.

Opeifa said because of the urgency of the matter, he had invited the executives of the National Union of Road Transport Workers, NURTW to the drivers' institute to be trained and recertified so that they would compel their members to urgently get of the ace broadcaster who, he described, as one of the country's finest models in broadcasting, culture, the arts and diplomacy

Born in Iperu-Remo, Ogun State, southwest Nigeria, on 18 March, 1935, the late Olusola attended the Roman Catholic School, Iperu-Remo between 1941 and 1943 and the Wesley School, Iperu from 1944 to 1947 and the Remo Secondary School, Sagamu from 1948 to 1953.

On his retirement in 1987 he was appointed Nigeria's Ambassador to Ethiopia & Resident Representative to the Organisation of African Unity and served till 1993 when he returned home to establish the African Refugees Foundation devoted to the management of the root causes of refugees and internal displacement.

As Chairman of the OAU Commission On Refugees (1988 1993), Leader of the OAU Zambia Election Monitoring Team (1992), he has addressed international gathering on Refugees, Election Processes, Media Development, Conflict Resolution, Culture and the Arts.

that Daniel and Seun were coming from a naming ceremony when the incident happened.

The children of the deceased ex-soldier have since contacted some youths in the area, namely Gafry Ipadeola, Olofin Azeez and Taoreed Akinjobi, to help retrieve the corpses of their father and Seun which are yet to be found as at the time of filing this report.

Speaking on how the victims were swept away by the flood, Gafry said, "the flood was so massive that you cannot even differentiate between the road. the gutters and the canal as big as it is. So, when the rain didn't stop on time, some people became impatient and starting wading through the flood to get home

"We were on the other end waving to them to exercise some patience and caution or better still wait for the rain to subside before they start going home but because some people had safely navigated their way through the flood, all other people entered it.

"When Baba and his daughter wanted to cross over to the filling station beside the canal probably to avoid being drenched by the rain, he didn't know that there was no slab where the poor girl put her foot and she slipped. As Baba too struggled to rescue her, the flood swept off his foot and he slipped also.

"Immediately they slipped into the canal, two people dived in to assist them but it was too late. In fact, we are yet to see one of the two guys that dived into the canal to rescue them,

According to Olofin Azeez, we have combed the entire canal from here down to Ajasa Command and we are yet to locate their corpses. Today again we will commence the search and we won't stop until

not about the money they want to give us, but we just have to sympathise with them.

"This incident is rather unfortunate and it is becoming a recurring decimal here. Sometimes we would just wake up after rain fall and see corpses in the canal. During rainy season like this, we are always prepared for the unex-pected. The task before us now is to assist the children of the deceased locate the corpse of their father," he said.

Speaking with P.M.NEWS at his palace, High Chief Amos Adejare Akinola, Baale of Akinola Kingdom, Aboru, described the incident as unfortunate.

"We saw the family of the deceased wailing after the rain stopped but we couldn't stop them and start asking questions or the names of the victims. We just have to sympathise with them too because they are human beings.

"It is quite unfortunate that flood has destroyed a lot of families and properties. This is not the first time this is happening in this area. The rain that fell on July 14, 2011 claimed the life of almost 14 people. Since then our appeal to both the state and federal government to come to our aid has

"The flood coming from Suberu Oje in Alagbado, Abule Egba and its environs is seriously affecting us here. The flood has always been so much that it defies community efforts. We heard that the contract has been awarded. The contractor handling the job is

not forthcoming.
"I want to appeal to our people too that they should stop dumping refuse indis-criminately in the canal. We would even appreciate it if the government can provide us with security agents that will arrest those dumping refuse in the canal so that it would serve as deterrent to others," he said.

> "With the advent of Urban Furniture Regulatory Unit, it is now illegal to build masts, towers, base stations and other related structures without permit in Lagos State. It is therefore mandatory for all telecoms operators or intending developers of telecommunications structure to apply to UFRU and obtain permit prior to carrying out any construction work on site,"

> He added that in line with the law establishing UFRU,

companies were now mandated to forward the addresses and locations of all telecoms infrastructure in the state to the unit for better monitoring and determination of the integrity of the structure.

According to him, UFRU had been mandated by the Lagos State Government to regulate the placement of urban furniture, including telecommunications antennae, masts, towers on land and buildings in Lagos, and to approve and supervise the location, position, dimension, appearance, display and manner in which urban furniture shall be fixed to land.

To enforce compliance, Ig-bokwe said UFRU shall from

He gave instances of recorded deaths and loss of property, resulting from collapsed masts and towers in the state aspect.

He said any permit granted in respect of any telecommunications structure shall be valid for a period of one year from the date of issue of the permit, and that holders of such expired development permit shall apply for its re-validation.

Addressing the issue of collapsed and dilapidated masts and towers, Igbokwe said henceforth, all collapsed or dilapidated structures shall be subjected to a new development permit before re-construction shall be allowed to take place.

He stated that all obligations attached to a development permit under the regulation of UFRU, would be carried out by the developer.
