Truck kills three in Ilorin

A truck laden with cement killed three persons in the early hours of yesterday on Oyun bridge, along Kwara State Polytechnic Road in Ilorin, the state capital.

According to an eyewitness, Ibrahim Tajudeen, a motorcycle overtook a car and had a head-on collision with an oncoming truck, which led

to the death of the three people. Tajudeen said some angry residents of the area consequently set the truck ablaze.

It was gathered that it took the intervention of men of the Fire Service, Civil Defence and policemen to calm the situation.

The mangled bodies of the deceased were later packed into bags and taken to the University of Ilorin Teaching

Hospital (UITH) mortuary.

Meanwhile, following the accidents and consequent protest by the natives, students of Kwara State Polytechnic could not sit for their examinations yesterday. The authorities of the institution had to postpone the examination till
