Prof found dead in varsity guest house

olice are now investigating the mystery, surrounding the death of a Professor of Law, who allegedly died in a guest house in one of the private universities in Anambra State.

A source said the professor, whose name was given as Jalaju, was a visiting lecturer to the university and lived in Port Harcourt.

On the day of the incident, the source said he arrived the institution, parked his vehicle and went to a guest house in the university. Two days after, the source further said, his car remained where it was parked, which raised a suspicion that something had gone amiss. This, it was gathered, warranted a search for the professor whose decomposing body was found in one of the rooms at the guest house.

"Days after his car was not moved, it was suspected that something was wrong, which attracted the attention of the security operatives that forced one of the guest house rooms open where offensive odour was emitting from and it was discovered that the body of the lecturer was already decomposing," the source concluded.

Efforts to contact the school authorities and the Anambra State Police Command proved abortive.
