

Court remands man, 20, over alleged murder of motorcyclist

An Osogbo Magistrate Court yesterday ordered a 20-year-old man, Morufu Ayoola, to be remanded in prison custody for allegedly killing a commercial motorcycle rider, Akeem Fasanya in Ikirun, headquarters of Ifelodun Local Government Area of Osun State.

Ayoola was said to have killed Fasanya on October 14, 2013 at Eweta area of Ikirun over a minor misunderstanding that ensued between them.

The Police Prosecutor, Mr. Merete Wilson told the court that Ayoola committed

the offence contrary to and punishable under Section 316 of the Criminal Code Cap 34 Vol II Laws of Osun State Nigeria, 2003.

Counsel to the accused person, Mr. Abimbola Ige, stated that the late motorcy-

clist had carried Ayoola on his motorcycle to his residence on the said date when a misunderstanding ensued between them over the fare charged by his client, alleging that the accused person in the process punched the

late Okada rider, which eventually led to his death.

The presiding Magistrate, Olusola Aluko, in his ruling remanded the accused in Ilesha prison till December 12, 2013 when the case would be heard.

Ekiti 2014: COSEG warns Fayemi, Bamidele against violence

The Coalition of Oodua Self-determination Groups (COSEG) has warned the Ekiti State Governor, Dr. Kayode Fayemi and Mr. Bamidele Opeyemi, a House of Representatives member on the platform of defunct Action Congress of Nige-

ria (ACN), not to plunge state into chaos ahead of 2014 governorship election.

COSEG's warning came on the heels of the recent reports of disruption of political meetings, maiming and killings, trailed by accusation and counter-accusations on both sides over who was responsible for what in the fracas that led to the breach

of the peace in the state.

The group, in a statement signed by Dayo Ogunlana and Razaq Olokoba, chairman and secretary respectively, warned the two parties to guide against any act that could cause irreparable damage to the polity and socio-economic life of the people of the state in particular and Yoruba nation in general.
