he Police in Ekiti State have arrested a serving

permanent secretary in Ondo State, the manager of an old bank generation Ikere-Ekiti and three others, over the robbery operation carried out in a commercial bank in Ikere-Ekiti last Thursday evening. The Police Public Relations Officer, (PPRO) Mr. Victor Babayemi, who disclosed this to newsmen in Ado Ekiti yesterday, said the permanent secretary

and three others had no connection with the robbery, but were arrested in a bush at Ijare, a border town between Ekiti and Ondo State while performing rituals at night in the bush where the bandits were hiding after they were pursued by the police. Some armed robbers had stormed a bank (name withheld) at 5.30pm in Ikere Ekiti, killing two persons, one policeman and a motorcyclist and injuring two during a gun duel with the

had already been cordoned off by the security agents in an attempt to smoke out the evil men from their hiding.

Babayemi added that they were arrested with a live goat and other fetish materials, saying that they would have been mistaken for robbers by his men and killed, but for the professionalism displayed by the police.

The permanent secretary, according to the police spokesman, said during interrogation that they were performing peace ritual for Ijare Community and Ondo State in general.

Babayemi clarified that the manager of the robbed

bank was held for alleged suspicion and hoarding of useful information from the Police that the bank would be receiving a large chunk of cash from the Central Bank of Nigeria, Akure branch the day the incident occurred.

His words: "It is saddening that the Bank Manager had to ask our men to leave

had to ask our men to leave for the station by 4pm when he knew the bullion van that was conveying large sum of money was already on its way to Emure Ekiti before coming to Ikere to offload. The action was suspicious and we have to get to the root of this.
