## Man, 30, dies of mysterious snake bite in Cross River

ragedy struck in Ekpene Ibiabong community in Odukpani Lo-cal Government Area of Cross River State as a mysterious snake bit and killed a 30-year-old man at the weekend.

The deceased, identified as, Itoe Nkun, a father of three, was said to have met his untimely death on his way back from the farm.

Narrating the incident to Daily Sun correspondent, who visited the area, the wife of the deceased, Mrs. Mma Itoe, said: "On that fateful day, my husband left the house for the farm with one of our sons without any inkling of problem, only to return from the farm with a snake bite on his right leg.

"When my husband came back from the farm, he looked moody and when I inquired to know what could have gone wrong, he replied that they were pursued and bitten by a mysterious snake.

I immediately advised him to go and be treated traditionally by a man who specialized in the treatment of snake bites."

Narrating further in an emotion laden tone, she stated that her husband was treated but the situation worsened the following day and he was rushed to hospital where he later gave up the ghost.

Lamenting the sudden death of her husband, Mma said: "I cannot understand what type of snake that killed my husband at this period when the children are still small. Now, who will assist me to train them? He has been a farmer all these while, so why is it now that snake should strike?"

Checks by Daily Sun revealed that Itoe had been buried.

Worried by his death, the youths in the community have set up a team to uncover the mystery behind the incident as the snake bite was believed to have been masterminded by evil doers.
