## Man, 50, killed in his farm in Doma

ragedy struck, last

Belt Today's checks, the
incident, which heightened
tension in the community, occurred when Late

Mr. Oboshi went to his farm and was allegedly murdered by unknown assailants.

Earlier, a search party had been organised by his son, Danladi Adagbo, who raised alarm that his father was yet to return from farm by evening of the same day.


A source close to the family told Middle Belt Today that when the search party could not locate the father and his motorcycle, the younger Adagbo returned to the farm the next day only to see the lifeless

body of his father lying in his pool of blood.

A stick was also found by his side with blood stain.

Young Adagbo alerted members of the family, who went to the farm with him and took the corpse home for burial according to the Alago rites.

Meanwhile, the matter has been reported to the police for investigation. Normalcy has since returned to Doma town following the ugly incident, as people were seen going about their normal businesses.
